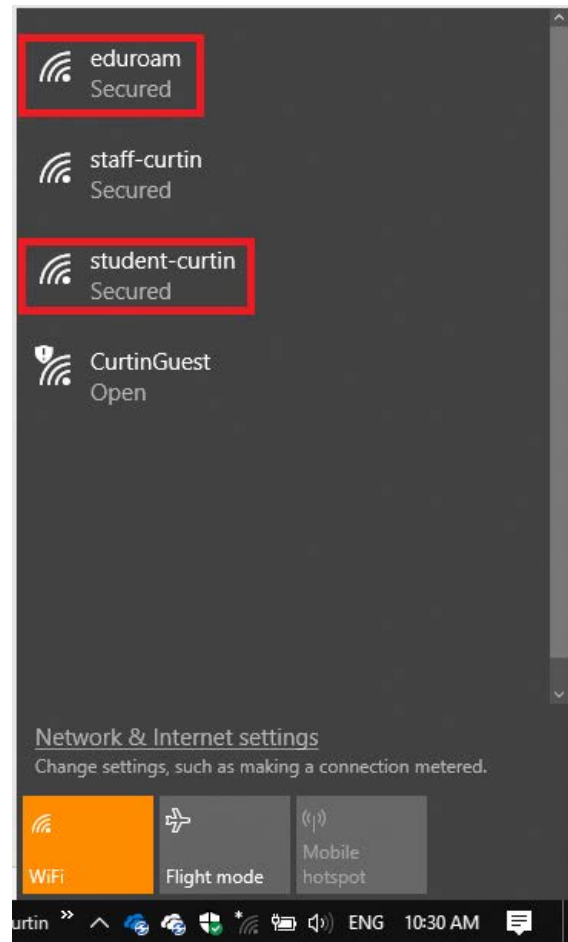
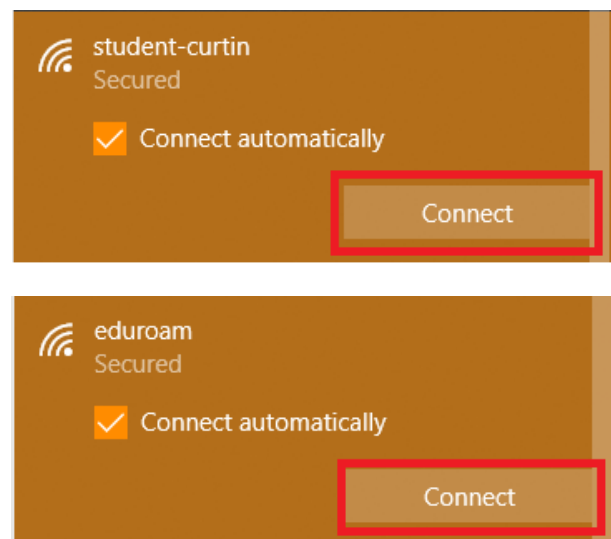


Connecting to wi-fi with Windows 10

1. Open Wi-Fi menu by selecting the Wi-Fi icon in the task bar.
2. Select the appropriate wireless network.
(student-curtin for Curtin Students, eduroam for visitors from participating institution)



3. Click 'Connect'





4. Enter the appropriate log in details

student-curtin (student ID and OASIS password)
eduroam (<id>@<institution>.edu.au)

5. Select 'OK' to connect
