


What is Copyright?

TO USE COPYRIGHTED WORK

Student permission requirements



You are permitted to make copies of work (10% or 1 chapter) under the Fair Dealing (research and study) provision of Copyright law




When you **communicate** your work (depositing thesis, publishing journals, etc), you must seek permission to use third party content




When permission isn't needed

- Quotes and short excerpts
- 'Fair dealing' for the purpose of criticism and review
- Public Domain content
- Openly licensed content

 (e.g. Creative Commons)



Seeking Permission



- Landing page of commercially published journals
 Copyright Clearing House RightsLinks Service
- Permission template letter on Copyright at Curtin website
- Start permissions early
- Retain copies of permissions



Thesis by compilation

- Publisher agreements vary between publications
- Students should always carefully read publisher agreements
- Ensure they will be allowed to re-use their own content
- Retain copies of agreements

Copyright-related questions in University Forms

There are two online forms students must sign relating to copyright.

- Thesis Submission for Examination
- Deposit of Final Thesis

- 7. I warrant that I have obtained, where necessary, permission from the copyright owners to use any third-party copyright material reproduced in the thesis, or to use any of my own published work (e.g. journal articles) in which the copyright is held by another party (e.g. publisher, co-author).
 A sample letter requesting permission to reproduce material in a thesis is available online at
 - Permission statements are included in an appendix to the thesis: or
 - No permission statements were required.



In summary

- If in doubt, contact the Library Copyright team (<u>Library-Copyright@curtin.edu.au</u>).
- 2. Students will almost always require permission to use third party content.
- There are some circumstances where permission may not be required.
- 4. For Thesis by Publication & Hybrid Theses, take special note of publisher agreements.
- Students have 2 copyright 'sign-offs' in University forms that can be found on the HDR website.
